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

NAME CHANGE

The Board of Trustees voted unanimously on May 23, 2001 to change the College's name from Vernon Regional Junior College to Vernon College.

GRADING SYSTEM

Vernon College uses the four point system for grade evaluation. The following grade notations are used in Grade Point Average (GPA) calculations.

SEMESTER HOURS

Course credit is based on the semester hour unit. Generally, a lecture course meets three hours each week during a sixteen (16) week semester, and a student receives three semester hours of credit for successfully completing such a course. To ensure that classes meet the required hours, weekly course time will increase for classes meeting in semesters of less than sixteen (16) weeks.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

An alphabetic prefix is used to designate the subject area of the course. Following the prefix is a numeric code. In a four-character code, the first digit denotes the academic level or year in which the courses are usually taken. The number "1" indicates freshman courses and the number "2" indicates sophomore courses. When the first number is "0", the course is developmental level. The second digit represents the semester credit hour value of the course. The third and fourth digits are for subject sequencing.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Normally all college-level course work satisfactorily completed at a regionally accredited institution will be accepted in transfer. A course-by-course evaluation of transfer work for students seeking a degree or certificate will appear on the transcript.

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
